Role Purpose

This is a multifunctional role that will support delivery of the management of the marine environment and inshore fisheries within the Devon and Severn Inshore Fisheries and Conservation Authority (D&S IFCA) in order to meet IFCAs' statutory duties and the delivery of the D&S IFCA's Annual Plan.

This will primarily involve providing effective and efficient enforcement of the relevant fisheries and conservation legislation by conducting enforcement patrols at sea and ashore and carrying out inspections of premises, vessels and vehicles.

The Authority adopts the national intelligence model. There is a requirement to collate, and report received sensitive information to support the risk-based approach to enforcement.

Context

D&S IFCA is one of ten statutory authorities in England responsible for the management of inshore fisheries for the conservation of marine resources and the marine environment. D&S IFCA core duties are set out in Section 153 (1) & (2) and 154 (1) of the Marine and Coastal Access Act 2009

153 Management of inshore fisheries

(1) The authority for an IFC district must manage the exploitation of sea fisheries resources in that district.

(2) In performing its duty under subsection (1), the authority for an IFC district must—

(a) seek to ensure that the exploitation of sea fisheries resources is carried out in a sustainable way,

(b) seek to balance the social and economic benefits of exploiting the sea fisheries resources of the district with the need to protect the marine environment from, or promote its recovery from, the effects of such exploitation,

(c) take any other steps which in the authority's opinion are necessary or expedient for the purpose of making a contribution to the achievement of sustainable development, and

(d) seek to balance the different needs of persons engaged in the exploitation of sea fisheries resources in the district.

154 Protection of marine conservation zones

(1) The authority for an IFC district must seek to ensure that the conservation objectives of any MCZ in the district are furthered.

General

• Assisting the Environment team with intertidal and at sea surveys when required

• Provide advice and guidance on enforcement & fisheries matters by liaising with a wide range of stakeholders.

Enforcement

- Responsible for the collation and handling of sensitive information to support the national Intelligence model
- Preparing received information for the internal and regional Tactical Coordination Groups.
- Preparing information and updating national database on inspections and investigations to support the delivery of national enforcement
- To manage the Monitoring Control Surveillance System (MCSS). Input casefiles accurately, upload boarding and sightings information. To extract previous offences for investigations.
- To undertake enforcement duties as directed, after having been issued with a D&S IFCA Enforcement Officer warrant
- To carry out boardings and inspections of fishing vessels within the D&S IFCA district, including at sea, and inspections of shore-based facilities, premises and vehicles to monitor compliance with regulations
- To gather evidence in relation to suspected fisheries offences and conduct investigations into contraventions of relevant fisheries legislation to prevent the undermining of the regulatory framework.
- Gather and develop intelligence from various sources to aid in developing enforcement work streams
- To interview suspects and witnesses, produce witness statement, prepare and complete investigation case files for review by the OIC (Senior Enforcement Officer)
- Provide oral evidence in Court
- To crew and act as helm on the D&S IFCA's vessels as directed by line manager after achieving the relevant RYA qualification
- To assist with maintenance, servicing and certification of equipment used for enforcement purposes
- Tow any of the Authority's vessels by road and oversee safe launch and recovery of the vessels.

Project Management

• To plan and lead enforcement focussed work streams or projects, identified with the line manager.

Must hold or obtain a current and unrestricted ENG 1 or ML5 medical certificate, and obtain mandatory MCA training certificates, as the duties of the role require sufficient mobility to be able to undertake boarding vessels at sea from a RIB, climb ladders, enter confined spaces, lift heavy boxes of fish or gear and walk long distances over uneven terrain. The normal duties of this role will involve the requirement to work unsocial hours including at weekends. It is a condition of employment that you exercise satisfactory level of flexibility to fulfil the objectives of the role You will also be expected to work in cold and wet environments on occasion, albeit with the provision of appropriate PPE for the conditions	Interview
